

ABERDEEN SCHOOL DISTRICT # 58

The five (5) trustee zones for Aberdeen School District will be as follows:

Trustee Zone No. 1

Beginning at the intersection of 300 South and Powerline Rd. on the northern district boundary.
East on the district boundary (300 South) then south on 1700 West then east on 700 south then south on 1600 West to the Snake River
Following the district boundary and the Snake River southwesterly to the Bingham-Bannock county line.
Following said county line southwesterly through the center of the American Falls Reservoir to an east-west unnamed Creek located parallel to and approximately one-half mile south of 1200 on the west side of the reservoir.
West from the Reservoir's western bank along unnamed creek to 2300 West.
North on 2300 West to 1100 South
West on 1100 South to 2600 West
South on 2600 West to 1200 South
North on Powerline Rd to the beginning

Trustee Zone No. 2

Beginning at the Bingham-Blaine county line, which is also the district's northern boundary.
East on the district boundary to Powerline Rd.
South on Powerline Rd to 1200 South
East on 1200 South to 2600 West
North on 2600 West to 1100 South
East on 1100 South to 2300 West
South on 2300 West about 1.4 miles to an unnamed creek
East on unnamed creek to the west bank of the American Falls Reservoir.
Continuing east on the Reservoir to the Bingham-Bannock county line and the district boundary.
Southwest on said county boundary and then following the Power-Bingham county line to a point where 1700 South extended to the east intersects the county boundary.
West on 1700 South extended and then 1700 South to 2700 West
South on 2700 West to 1750 South (Central St)
West on 1750 South, Central St. to 2nd East (City of Aberdeen)
North on 2nd East to Ada
West on Ada to 2750 West (Slough Rd.)
North on 2750 West to 1700 South
West on 1700 South (Boat Dock Rd.) to 3000 West
South on 3000 West to the district boundary at Schroeder Rd or 2300 South
Following the district boundary west to 3600 West then north to the beginning.

Trustee Zone No. 3

Beginning at the intersection of Powerline Rd. and 1700 South (Boat Dock Rd.)
 East on 1700 South to 2750 West (Slaugh Rd.)
 South on 2750 West to Ada
 East on Ada to 2nd East
 South on 2nd East to Central
 West on Central to Powerline Rd.
 North on Powerline Rd to beginning.

Trustee Zone No. 4

Beginning at the intersection of 1700 South and 3000 West
 East on 1700 South to Powerline Rd.
 South on Powerline Rd. to Central.
 East on Central to 3rd West
 South on 3rd West to Custer
 East on Custer to 2nd West
 South on 2nd West to 1800 South
 East on 1800 South to the city limits of Aberdeen at approximately 2700 West
 North then east then northeast then northwest on the city boundary to 1750 South.
 West on 1750 South to 2700 West extended south.
 North on 2700 West extended to 1700 South.
 East on 1700 South and 1700 South extended east into the American Falls Reservoir and its intersection with the Bingham-Power county line.
 Southwest on said county line to the southern boundary of the district, and continuing west on the district boundary and said county line to 3000 West.
 North on 3000 West to beginning.

Trustee Zone No. 5

Beginning at the intersection of Central and 3rd West
 East on Central and becoming 1750 south to the easternmost city limits of the city of Aberdeen
 Southeast then southwest then west then south on the city limits to 1800 South.
 West on 1800 South to 2nd West
 North on 2nd West to Custer
 West on Custer to 3rd West
 North on 3rd West to beginning

REDEFINING TRUSTEE ZONES

The boundaries of the trustee zones in this district are to be defined and drawn so that, as reasonably as may be, each such zone shall have approximately the same population. Trustee zones in this district will be determined to have approximately the same population when the populations of each trustee zone do not vary by more than ten percent (10%).

The board of trustees will initiate a proposal to redefine and change trustee zones at the first meeting following the report of the decennial census. In addition, the board or a patron may propose that a trustee zone be redefined at any time. Within one hundred twenty (120) days

following the report of the decennial census or the receipt of a petition to redefine and change the trustee zones, the board will prepare a proposal for a change which will equalize the population in each trustee zone. The proposal will include a legal description of each trustee zone as the same would appear pursuant to the proposal, a map of the district showing how each trustee zone would appear, and the approximate population each trustee zone would have, should the proposal become effective.

The superintendent or designee will be authorized to review the decennial census, or any proposal to change trustee zone boundaries, and determine whether there has been a shift in population which causes the current trustee zones to not contain approximately the same populations. If it is determined that the population has changed so that the trustee zones are not of approximately the same population, the board will appoint a committee, composed of interested parties, to review the matter. The committee will propose to the board modifications to the trustee zone boundaries which are intended to equalize the population in the various trustee zones.

The proposal will be submitted to the State Board of Education for approval. The State Board of Education will approve or disapprove of the proposal within sixty (60) days and give notice of its decision to the board in writing. If approved, the trustee zones will change pursuant to the proposal. If disapproved, the board must submit a revised proposal to the State Board of Education within forty-five (45) days.

IMPLEMENTATION OF PROPOSAL TO REDEFINE TRUSTEE ZONES

At the next regular meeting of the board following the approval of the proposal, the board will appoint from its membership a trustee for each new trustee zone to serve as trustee until that incumbent trustee’s three (3) year term expires. If the current board membership includes two (2) incumbent trustees from the same new trustee zone, the board will select the incumbent trustee with the most seniority as the trustee to serve the remainder of his or her three (3) year term. If both incumbent trustees have equal seniority, the board will choose one (1) of the trustees by the drawing of lots. If there is a trustee vacancy in any trustee zone, the board will appoint an individual residing in the trustee zone to serve as trustee until the next annual meeting.
